HOW TO GET AN INSTRUMENT

OPTION #1: Rent or purchase an instrument from Menchey Music

- 1. Complete the online or in-person (at Parent Meeting) rental agreement with Menchey Music.
- 2. Menchey Music will deliver the instrument and materials to the school prior to your first lesson.

OPTION #2: Rent or purchase an instrument from another music store

- 1. Visit the music store to make the necessary arrangements for the instrument and other materials.
- 2. Send the instrument to school earlier than Monday, October 4th so your music teacher can make sure everything is set up for success.

OPTION #3: Purchase or borrow a privately owned or used instrument (Do not purchase a string instrument! The size will change as the student grows!)

- 1. Take the instrument to a music store or have a knowledgeable repair person check it to make sure it is in good playing condition.
- 2. Purchase all the necessary materials for the instrument you choose (See equipment lists on the next page).
- 3. Have all "tune-ups, fix-ups, clean-ups, etc." completed early so that you can send the instrument to school with your child on the morning of the first lesson - Monday, October 4, 2021.

*****IMPORTANT REMINDER****

You may just get a drum pad and stand and sticks.

Although there may be inexpensive "bargain" instruments at department stores, in catalogs, and on the internet, the Lower Dauphin School District recommends that you rent, lease or purchase an instrument from a reputable music dealer. Such stores have technicians and repair persons who will service the instruments if they need adjustment or repair. These technicians also set-up the instrument in good playing condition for a beginning instrumentalist. A poor quality instrument could have negative consequences on a student's playing and success in the instrumental program due to poor sound production, frustration and frequent repairs.
